Dance like nobody's watching.

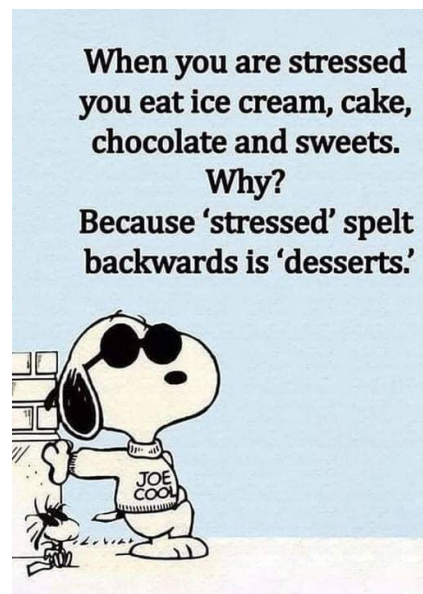
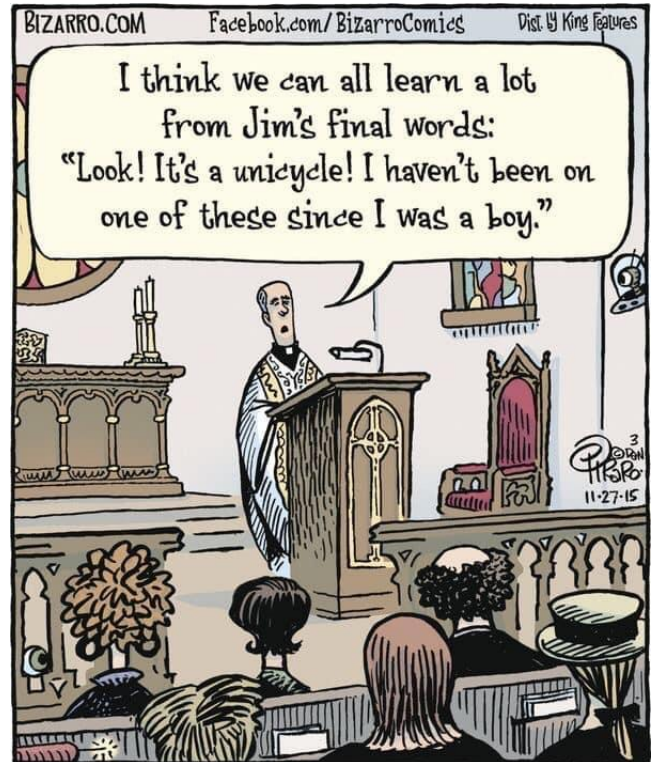
Watch the sunset.

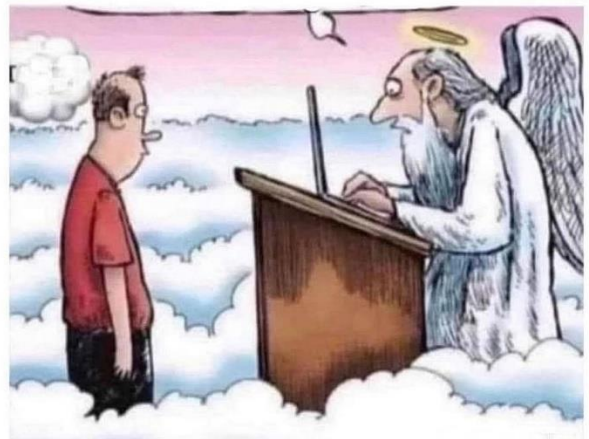

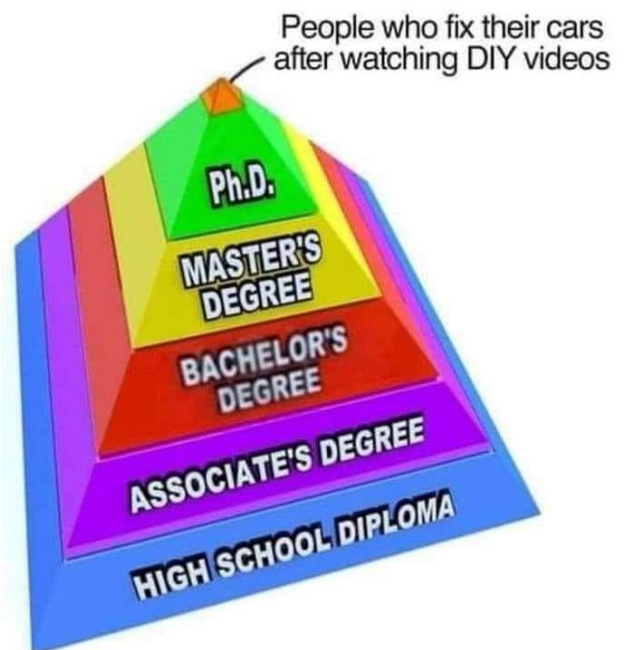
**THIS NEW WRENCH IS AMAZING.
